

Key Phase-Out Dates

November 20, 2010

- A worker must exhaust their regular state benefits by this date in order to enter the first tier of EUC08. You may file a new EUC08 claim through week ending 11/27/10 with an effective date of 11/21/10.

November 27, 2010

- A worker must exhaust their first or second tier of EUC08 by this date in order to move to the next tier. After this date, a worker cannot move into another tier.
- If you are currently receiving EUC08, you may continue to receive EUC08 payments from your current tier during a phase-out period; no EUC08 payments can be made for weeks of unemployment beginning after April 30, 2011.

December 7, 2010

- Federal Additional Compensation (FAC) is no longer payable for eligible workers who were in the program by June 2, 2010. This means that week-ending December 11, 2010 is the last week the \$25 FAC is payable.

April 30, 2011

- Expiration of EUC08 Program. No EUC08 first, second or third tier benefits may be made for any week of unemployment beginning after April 30, 2011.

Program Explanations for EUC and FAC:

Emergency Unemployment (EUC08):

Special emergency unemployment enacted by Congress. This program was approved in Tiers.

Federal Additional Compensation (FAC):

This program allowed for an additional \$25 per week in weekly payment for any week you were entitled.

The extension on July 22, 2010 allowed for extension of the FAC payment if your claim was effective prior to May 30, 2010. FAC will continue until you have exhausted or December 11, 2010, whichever comes first. New initial unemployment claims effective May 30, 2010 and after was not eligible for the FAC payments.
